Creative Scotland

We've been awarded £13,890 from Creative Scotland's Open Fund to deliver a year-long programme of activity in response to the Covid-19 pandemic. This focuses on new billboard commissions, a residency, Inverness' first Zine Festival, outdoor events, professional development and a publication for recent graduates in the Highlands & Islands.
